Our students

Twenty-one theatre students and professionals from 13 countries around the world from China, Great Britain, Netherlands, Ukraine, Latvia, Ireland, Slovenia, Germany, Norway, Czech Republic, Austria, Italy, and Switzerland participated in the summer school.

Ateliers

Participants took part in four major ateliers as the initial part of the Summer school. Jana Svobodová's atelier focused on the Viewpoints method and the textual sources in the creation of social-specific theatre. Jaroslav Hrdlička's atelier was on the different uses of video in the context of theatrical work. Jan Burian led students to focus on different ways of musical creation by taking the sound as an integral part of stage action. Philipp Schenker's atelier explored the relation between objects and personal stories, by focusing on the use of objects on stage.

Lectures of the experts

Apart from these ateliers, participants attended to lectures by Ondrej Hrab focusing on the historical roots of social-specific theatre, and the relation between theatre and sociology. Stefan Kaegi gave a lecture on a wide range of progressive theatrical forms they use in his works with Rimini Protokoll. Participants also attended lectures on theatre making in unusual places by Henk Keizer, possibilities of cultural partnerships by Mattijs Maussen, and on principles of text writing by Pieter de Buysser.

Specific workshops

In addition to these ateliers and lectures, Pieter de Buysser, Zuzana Sykorova, and Pavel Kotlik worked with the participants regarding creation of dramatic text, body movement, and light design respectively.

Creative groups/ final performances

As a major part of the summer school, participants formed small creative groups and prepared short performances under the supervision of all instructors.


